

WALK FOR WATER UPDATE



In the past 2 years Varsity lakes Middle School students have raised a total of \$13,926 to bring clean water to 2 schools in Kenya and 2 in Tanzania. The clean water project for the Namarambi Primary school was completed over the summer.

The funds we raised came just in time! It saved the school from being closed by the government because of their water and sanitation crisis. The work done has allowed Namarambi to stay open for 455 students.

There is a new 50,000 liter rainwater catchment system that supplies safe clean water. Hand-washing stations were installed so that students can clean up after using their new latrines. In addition, students and staff have received training in sanitation and hygiene.

CLASSROOM NEWS

Varsity Lakes Middle School students have been busy in their Language Arts and Reading classes building relationships and becoming familiar with Varsity's expectations and procedures. More specifically, Language Arts classes are using creative ways to do this by having students create One-Pagers of themselves, which will later serve as a great Language Arts project when studying characters or theme. Other students are writing and presenting two-voice poems for the same reason. Overall, the Language Arts and Reading departments are working diligently to prepare the first base-line essay for all students, which will be given in the first month of school.

IMPORTANT ANNOUNCEMENT

Lightning Families:

It is our goal to ensure that every student has a safe, rigorous learning environment free from unnecessary disruptions that detract from instructional time. This past school year, our administrative team noticed an increase in the amount of instructional time lost due to student violations of the Code of Student Conduct as it relates to electronic devices.

This communication is an effort to ensure that our students understand the rules regarding electronic device possession and usage. For the 2019-2020 school year, we will strictly enforce the Student Code of Conduct regarding cell phones and personal electronic devices (see below). Working in partnership with you, we can effectively reduce major disciplinary infractions, as well as disruptions to the learning environment, and improve student safety on campus.

30. Electronics/Telecommunication Devices (ETD)

Students may possess cell phones and other personal electronic devices while on school grounds during regular school hours, however they must be turned off at all times unless utilized for an approved activity.

Any display or use of cell phones and/or personal electronic devices, including headphones and/or ear pods, without permission while the student is on campus will result in disciplinary consequences. The expectation is that once students arrive on campus at Varsity Lakes Middle, their cell phone, headphones, ear pods, and other electronic devices are turned off and stored. We ask that you please speak with your child about this policy and expectations for the upcoming school year at Varsity Lakes Middle.

We understand that there may be occasions when you need to contact your child during the school day. However, we ask that you please refrain from contacting your child via their cell phone. Rather, we ask that you call the school directly at (239)694-3464. Our front desk receptionist will take a message and immediately deliver the message to your child.

Your cooperation and partnership to create a safer and more secure learning environment free from disruptions and distractions at Varsity Lakes Middle for the 2019-2020 school year is greatly appreciated. If you have any questions and/or concerns regarding this policy, do not hesitate to contact us.

CELL PHONE/HEADPHONE/EAR PODS/ELECTRONIC DEVICE EXPECTATIONS

Cell phones, headphones, ear pods, and other electronic devices (personal electronic devices) are to be turned off and stored at all times while on the campus of VLMS. Cell phones, headphones, ear pods, and other electronic devices (personal electronic devices) may not be used while on campus without permission from a teacher. Display or use of personal electronic devices without permission will result in the following consequences:

lst Offense = Device is confiscated. The student will receive a BOLT card citation in Castle and the parent will be contacted. The student may pick up the device at the end of the school day.

2nd Offense = Device is confiscated. The student will receive a discipline referral in Castle, and an after school detention will be assigned. The student may pick up the device at the end of the school day.

3rd Offense = Device is confiscated. The student will receive a discipline referral, and one day of Internal Suspension

and/or Saturday detention will be assigned. The parent must pick up the device in the front office at the school. Continued Offenses will result in progressive discipline consequences.

SCHOOL MESSENGER COMMUNICATE:

The School District of Lee County uses School Messenger Communicate to share important messages about your child's education. The system allows us to call, text and email you. To receive messages from your child's school, you need to create a free account. Just go to www.leeschools.net/parent_portal to sign up. In order to receive text messages you must opt in by texting YES, OPTIN or SUBSCRIBE to 67587. The District is not allowed to send you texts unless you opt in.

NEW DISTRICT APP:

WE HAVE AN APP FOR THAT! The School District of Lee County mobile app provides quick, easy access to valuable information and tools. Search "The School District of Lee County" in the app store and look for an icon with the District Seal on a blue background. Once you've downloaded the app you can subscribe to your child's school, pull events directly from the school calendar into your calendar, check bus schedules, lunch menus and more!

To ensure smooth delivery of this communication, we suggest you add school@peachjar.com to your email contacts. When you receive your first digital flyer, be sure to click "always display images." This "green" initiative saves our school paper, reduces copy costs and removes a significant administrative burden from teachers, office staff, and volunteers!

MESSAGE FROM OUR CLINIC

Dear Parents and Guardians:

We would like to see your child in school every day, learning, healthy, and excited to participate in all of our school activities; however, in the event your child is ill (temperature above 100, vomiting, uncontrollably coughing, has a runny nose, or red draining eyes), please keep him/her home and seek medical advice. In addition, in the event of an emergency, please have your child's emergency card, with all contact numbers where you can be reached, dropped off in the clinic.

Please check with your child's doctor to make sure their immunizations are current as well as any medical information, or need for medication while at school. Please submit the proper documentation and permission forms to our clinic.

6th Graders remember to get the needed immunizations for 7th grade.

You must have a TDAP given after August 2006, 3 Hepatitis vaccines, 2 MMR's and 2 Varicella. Please turn in the copy of the immunization record to the school before the open house on August 8, 2019.

The Lee County Health Department offers FREE immunizations (shots) to children under 18. They are located at 3920 Michigan Ave. Fort. Myers, Fl. 33916. It is by appointment only.

Remember, prevention is key to keeping your child healthy.
