STUDENT CELL PHONE USE

We are seeing an influx of student cell phone useage on campus during the academic day. In the event that your child has their phone out and visable during the day, please be aware that it will be taken and held for the duration of the day. If this becomes a habitual offense, it will be taken until such time that you can come to campus and collect it. Students will receive a written infraction each time they are seen with their phone during the day. We understand that students have phones for a variety of reasons, however, while they are on our campus they are not to be out or used. While phones serve as a very valuable tool it is not a tool that is necessary during the school day. Should you have an emergancy and need to reach your child immediately, contact the school and we will be happy to assist you with this.

If you have any questions or concerns, please don't hesitate to contact us.

Cell phones, headphones, ear pods, and other electronic devices are to be turned off and stored at all times while on the campus of VLMS. Cell phones, headphones, ear pods, and other electronic devices may not be used while on campus without permission from a teacher. Display, possession, or use of personal electronic devices without permission will result in the following consequences:

1st Offense = Device is confiscated. The student will receive a BOLT card citation in Castle and the parent will be contacted. The student may pick up the device at the end of the school day.

2nd Offense = Device is confiscated.

The student will receive a BOLT card citation in Castle and the parent will be contacted. The parent must pick up the device in the front office at the school.

Continued Offenses will result in progressive discipline consequences including but limited to after school detention, internal suspension and/or Saturday school.

POSITIVE BEHAVIORAL INTERVENTIONS AND SUPPORTS

Varsity Lakes Middle is proud to be a Positive Behavioral Interventions and Support (PBIS) School. Mr. Andrew Lee, JD explains "PBIS is a proactive approach that schools use to improve school safety and promote positive behavior. The focus of PBIS is prevention, not punishment. PBIS recognizes that students can only meet behavioral expectations if they know what the expectations are. Everyone learns what's considered to be appropriate behavior and uses a common language to talk about it. Throughout the school day — in class, at lunch, and on the bus — students understand what's expected of them. According to several studies over the years, PBIS leads to better student behavior. In many schools that use PBIS, students receive fewer detentions and suspensions, and earn better grades. There's also some evidence that PBIS may lead to less bullying."

Here at VLMS we are working to integrate even more PBIS strategies into our learning environment. For the remainder of the year, PBIS incentives will be announced to students. All students will be invited to take part in these activities as long as they have met the required criteria: no referrals or major discipline issues starting 2/16/2021. We believe that students should be rewarded for their positive choices and because of that, our PBIS team is working hard to plan activities that are sure to be enjoyed by everyone.




VLMS TUTORING



Home Connect Expectation Reminders Lee Home Connect is an instructional model where students follow their schedule virtually from home. It is a structured learning environment and students are expected to be in their virtual class the entire period. Lee Home Connect mirrors the in-person classroom experience therefore students are expected to:

- Arrive to school on-time by 9:45am
- Arrive to each class period on time according to the bell schedule
- Have their video turned on at all times
- Submit all assignments on-time through their Google Classroom
- Follow school and district Code of Conduct expectations
- Adhere to school dress code
- Turn off and put cell phones away
- Communicate with teacher when assistance is needed
- Use the Zoom chat feature for academic purposes only
