November is upon us! We are nearing 2nd quarter mid-term grades. It is important to continue to support your student by initiating academic responsibilities. In the middle school years, we are preparing students for high school. It is tough because the student has more responsibility for their education in the teaching and learning process. Each student must manage the classwork and homework for each class and teacher.
