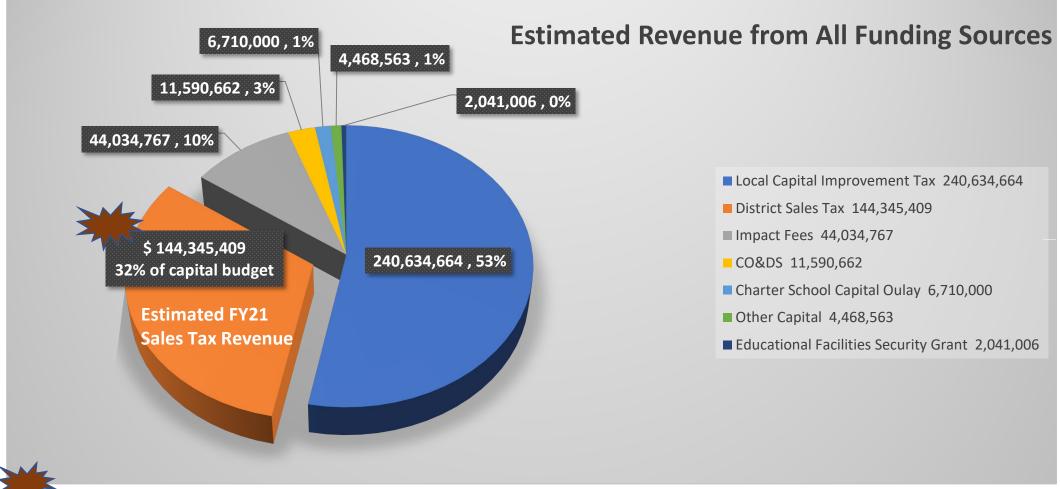

FY21 Capital Budget - \$453.8M



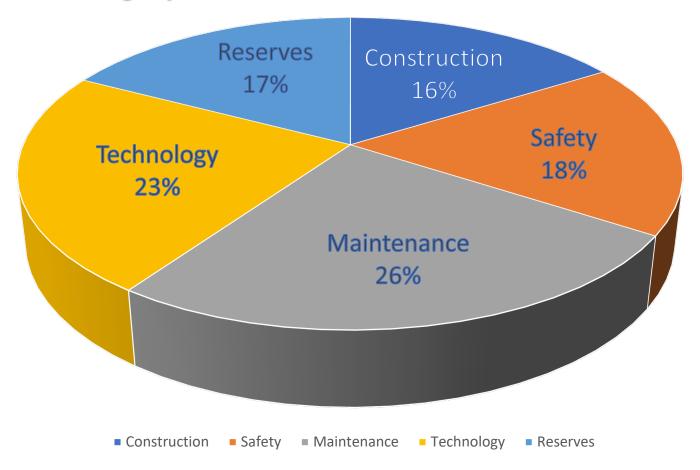


ISSOC focus - sales tax revenue & projects

Building Repairs – Edison Park Elementary School

- Exterior of reinforced concrete piers are in poor condition, are deteriorating, and need to be replaced.
- Project scheduled to start week of June 21, 2021.

Cabinet Replacement Project – San Carlos Park Elementary

(Before Project Photos)







- Existing cabinets exceed life expectancy of 20 years and they are deteriorating and falling apart.
- Formica is chipped in multiple areas and are a safety concern.
- The cabinets are original to the school and the previous colors can no longer be matched.

Cabinet Replacement Project – San Carlos Park Elementary

(After Project Photos)





- New cabinets have rounded thermofoil doors to prevent future chipping and sharp edges.
- Thermofoil exterior surfaces improve aesthetics and allows for easier wipe-downs.
- Larger cabinets went from 2 large doors to 4 smaller doors for easier access.
- Smaller cabinet doors, for larger cabinets, weigh less and reduce the wear & tear on cabinetry hardware.

Cabinet Replacement Project – San Carlos Park Elementary

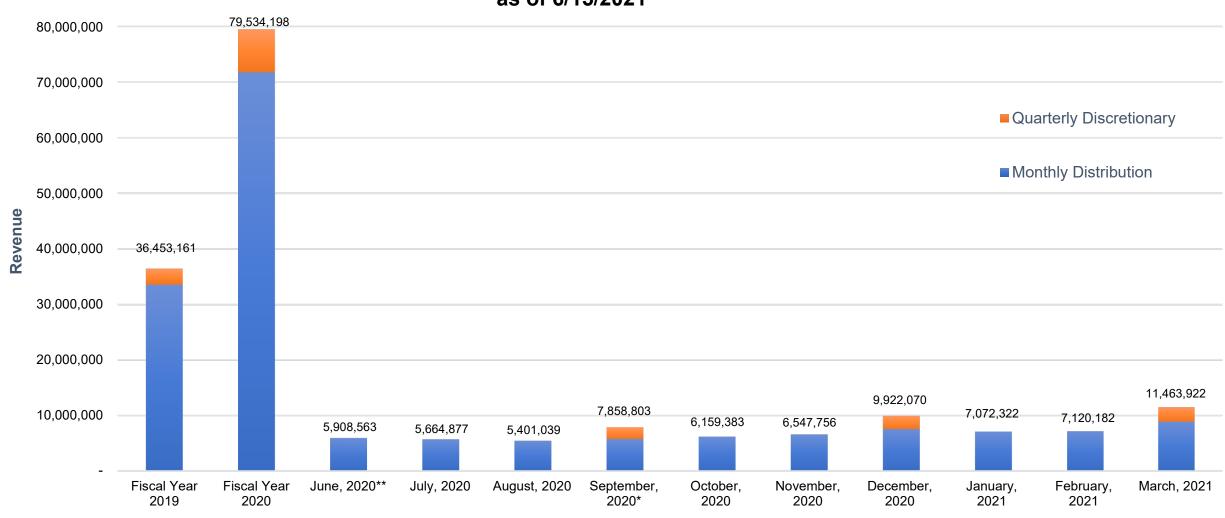

- New cabinets are aesthetically pleasing and offer a modern look in the classrooms.



Monthly Sales Tax Collections by Month Earned as of 6/15/2021

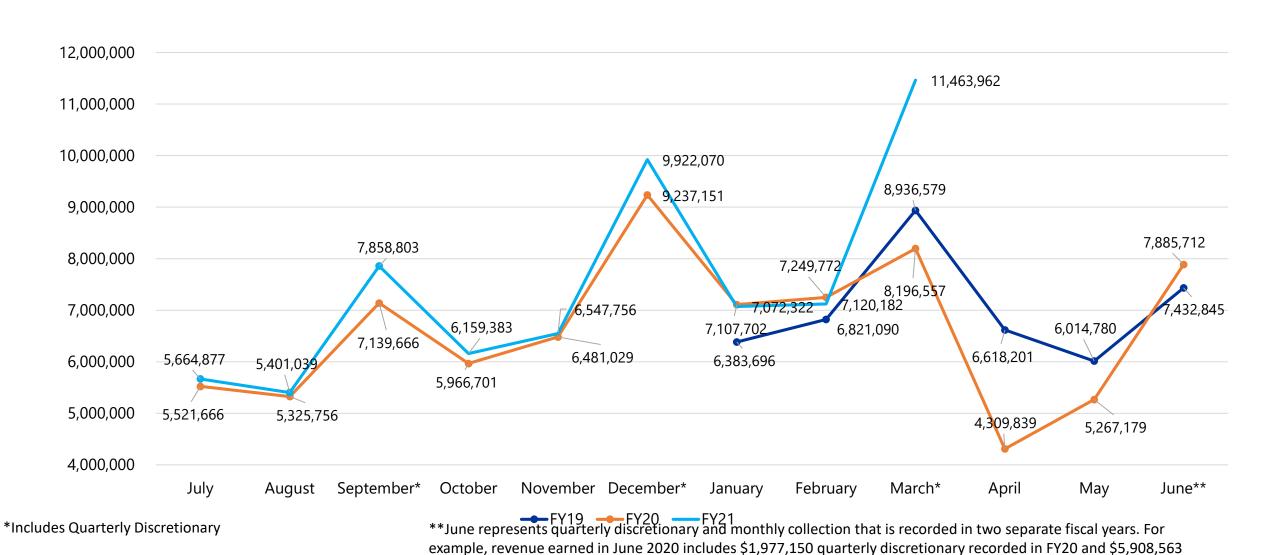

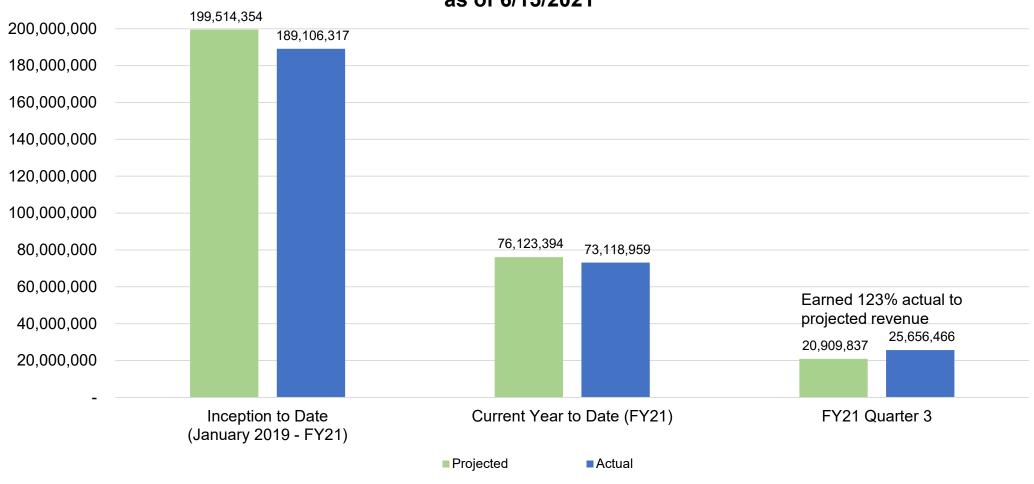
MONTHLY SALES TAX COLLECTIONS YEAR OVER YEAR BY MONTH EARNED as of 6/15/2021
