## Copyright

The following guidelines shall be followed with regard to copyright of original works which can be perceived, reproduced or otherwise communicated, directly or with the aid of machine or device:

- (1) Copyright law extends to the original works of authorship, fixed at any tangible medium of expression now known or later developed, from which can be perceived, reproduced or otherwise communicated, either directly or with the aid of machine or device.
- 6 (2) Ideas cannot be copyrighted. Copyright protects the manner in which an idea has
  7 been expressed, which is in a work of authorship.
- (3) Works of authorship fall into the following categories:
  - (a) Literary works
    - (b) Musical works, including accompanying words
    - (c) Dramatic works, including accompanying music
    - (d) Pantomimes and choreographic works
      - (e) Pictorial, graphic and sculptural works
      - (f) Sound recordings
      - (g) Motion pictures and other audio/visual works
- (h) Architectural works
- 37 (4) The Copyright Act provides that learning institutions have the opportunity to use
  38 copyrighted work for purposes of teaching, scholarship or research without
  39 infringement of the law. This principle is called fair use. The following four basic
  40 factors determine fair use:
- 42 (a) Purpose the usage is for non-profit or educational purpose, use is 43 permissible.
